We finally connected with Mr. Melvin Byler to discuss the tree removal from his property south of the airport. We hope to have a plan in place shortly.

We are awaiting a commitment from Mr. Joe Sprague from Cadillac Aviation to set up a satellite shop here.

The Ice Cream Social and Concert was a great success with nearly 100 attendees. A paraglider came to fly around our airport. This type of flying is gaining in popularity. (See photo next page)

STREET WORK. We watered trees several times through out the month and put stone in the tree grates in the DDA area. We saw cut the asphalt to get ready for new asphalt, swept the edges of Witbeck and prepped for asphalt. We bladed and brined roads several times in July. We installed manhole risers on Witbeck, graveled the shoulders, did shoulder work and trimmed trees on Witbeck. We repaired a manhole that was hit by contractors, did yard cleanup on Sunset, road construction restoration on Sixth St and saw cut for patch work. We also hot mixed areas throughout town all day on the 31st.

WATER & SEWER WORK: Water and sewer work this month included our regular schedule of Miss Digs, meter readings, shut offs for non-payment, manual reads, meter work, and washing sewers/preventive maintenance, and cleaned storm sewers. We located sewer leads on Mission and repaired a water leak on Sixth Street. We repaired two leaks on Sixth Street that the contractor hit. We spotted the water main on Glendale on the 10th. Replaced a sewer at 214 E Seventh and repaired the storm sewer and sewer on Sixth Street. We put in sewer for David Coffman and worked on the well at Emerald Isle. We rodded a sewer on Sunset and repaired the sewer.

CEMETERY WORK: We had 5 full burials at Cherry Grove Cemetery in July. And repaired a water line in the cemetery.

DREDGING: We re-installed the turbidity curtain in front of the dam on the 10th. We hauled spoils all month long. Cleaned up the debris around the barge and dredged.

MISCELLANEOUS WORK: We chipped brush, cleaned, washed and waxed trucks, and cleaned the garage on several days. Trimmed trees, took down all the American flags and hung Old 27 banners. And we took the Police departments golf cart to the fair.

Monthly Fire Department Activity Report July 2025 Incident Responses: 25 Year to Date Total: 143

July was a a month that mirrored the month before with a variety of calls. 25 times the CFD was dispatched for emergency service. On the 5th the CFD as well as six other departments were dispatched to assist Harrison Fire at the Wagon Wheel Motel where the building was fully engulfed. We responded with tenders and the aerial. This was a difficult fire to control due to the expansive size of the building. Once the fire was extinguished, we determined that our aerial alone placed 60,000 gallons of water one the fire. Also in July, on the 13th we responded to the south end of Clare for one of two grass fires during the month. Both fires led to no damages however they were fairly large for this time of the year. This is a reminder that even though we are late in the summer the extremely dry conditions still make wildfires a distinct possibility.

In the month of July, we were also excited to host the annual Ethan Gage Junior Firefighter Academy. That was held on July 18th and roughly 30 kids attended. As always it was a huge success and the kids all had a blast! We would like to give a big thanks to all the extra volunteers that come together to make this event such a success! We can't wait to see what next years academy will bring! Training this month consisted of our regular apparatus check as well as pump operation, drivers training, and nozzle and streams training.

July was a busy for the Clare Police Department, with several events and activities.

One of the biggest highlights was our Youth Police Academy, held July 7th–11th. This year we shortened the academy from two weeks to one. In past years, the longer schedule made it tough for families to commit during the busy summer months, and this change turned out to be a great move. We had 28 kids take part, which is a jump from previous years, and the pace of the one-week format kept everyone engaged from start to finish. We owe a big thank you to MMR, the Michigan State Police, Midland Police Department, Clare County Sheriff's Department, and many other departments and organizations who pitched in. A special shout-out goes to several of our Clare City Reserve Officers who took time off from their regular jobs to help teach and mentor. Their commitment is what makes programs like this such a success, and we're already looking forward to next year.

We also worked closely with the Clare County Sheriff's Department during the Clare County Fair. Several of our reserve officers joined forces with county reserves and deputies at the fairgrounds, handling security and calls for service. This partnership is good training for our reserves, a chance to share ideas, and a way to build relationships with neighboring agencies while serving our community.

Earlier in the month, I attended the Michigan Justice for Children Conference in Detroit. The breakout sessions were full of practical, useful information that will help us continue our partnership with the Northern Michigan Alliance for Children. Together, we're working hard to better serve and protect abused and neglected children in our area.

With summer in full swing, traffic picked up noticeably in July. Our officers responded with an increase in stops and citations compared to last month, keeping a close eye on roadway safety during this busy season.

All in all, July was a month full of community connection, great teamwork, and meaningful progress. I'm proud of the work our officers and reserves put in and grateful for the strong partnerships that help us serve Clare so well.

- The lagoon sampler program was corrupt so installed a new program was installed
- Cut up at tree that fell by the driveway
- Sharpened blades and cleaned up the mower deck
- Put a new fuel line on the leaf blower
- Put a new shield on the weed Wacker
- Received the gas meter back from being calibrated
- Replaced the transducer on lift station 8.
- Restarted the starter on lift station 8.

Continued, Current and Upcoming Programs and Event

Senior Cards and Coffee takes place on Thursday mornings at the Pere Marquette District Library from 10-12 p.m. in one of the small group rooms. The card games that are played are determined by what the group wants to play and the group is supplied with coffee and card decks.

Art in Sculpture is a collaboration between Clare Parks and Recreation, Middle Michigan Development Corporation, the Clare County Arts Council, local artist Jeff Best and is headed by C. Santini. The new installation pieces will be at their current location until April 30, 2025. Simmer created the AIS brochure and the Survey Monkey online voting page. Simmer had assisted the CCAC to create the promotional flyers to help secure donations to purchase the "My Favorite Thing" dog sculpture that was a part of the 2024/25 Art in Sculpture event. The campaign was successful and the Arts Council was able to purchase the dog sculpture and it was been relocated to the library. The dog will be used in programming between the library and Clare Parks and Recreation.

Scheduling for the 2025 **Clare Summer Concert Series** started on June 5th and is officially coming to an end on August 14, 2025. The concerts took place from 6-8 p.m. at Shamrock Park and feature a variety of musicians. The crowd varied depending on weather and local events, but we usually had anywhere from 85-150 people in attendance.

The **Fall Youth Soccer League** early registration started on May 15, 2025 and the late registration ended on July 17th. Simmer completed team set-up and got the team jerseys and supplies ordered. The coaches meeting will be held on August 14th and the coach contact by date is August 23rd. Soccer will run every Saturday from September 6 – October 11th this year. The team pictures date has been scheduled for mid-September with a local photographer.

The **Emerald Isle Recreation Complex Raffle** tickets came in and were bundled into packs of 30 and each player will receive one pack and will be able to request more if they want. The tickets will be \$2/each and all proceeds will go towards Emerald Isle Recreation Complex projects. The players who sell all of their tickets are able to request additional packs and for every pack they sell they are entered into a player drawing for various prizes. The raffle prizes are: 1st Place - \$500, 2nd Place - \$250 and 3rd Place - \$100. The drawing will take place on October 11, 2025 at 12 p.m. at the Emerald Isle Recreation Complex.

Past Events/Programs

Hospice Butterfly Release took place again at Shamrock Park. This Butterflies in the Park Event will take place at 1 p.m. under the small pavilion and in the park area Clare Parks and Recreation has hosted MyMichigan Hospice for the last ten years in our parks. This event gives community members an opportunity to remember or honor loved ones who have had a special and positive impact on their lives. Butterflies in the Park is a time-honored tradition that has been meaningful for

donors and families alike. Held under the auspices of MyMichigan Health Foundation in parks across the region, individuals gather to reflect upon their loved ones and enjoy a beautifully symbolic, live butterfly release.

This is **Mid Michigan Brass Band** held a free community concert on August 8, 2025 at 7 p.m. in Shamrock Park.

Depot Days took place on August 9, 2025 from 10-1 p.m. with Shari Buccilli and Simmer heading it. There was a silent auction fundraiser and bake sale at the event and proceeds will go towards the Depot Restroom Project. We had the Mid Michigan College children's barrel train. We are waiting on a final tally of what all was taken in.

The **Ethan Gage Junior Fire Fighter Academy** took place on July 18, 2025 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. The Parks and Recreation Dept. along with volunteers from the Clare Fire Department and MMR participated in and assisted the children enrolled in the camp. The fee for the academy was \$12.00 per person, and included a t-shirt, award certificate and a pizza lunch.

Wonders of Water Camp took place on August 1, 2025 from 9 a.m. - 3 p.m. at Shamrock Park. This camp is collaboration between Clare Parks and Recreation, Waste Water Treatment Department, MSU Extension and the Pere Marquette District Library. Participants were educated on the water cycle and the value of water as a resource and to do some educational activities involving water (bug picking, sampling, etc.). The day finished off with fun water-based activities. Letherer Truss sponsored a pizza lunch for the participants. The cost to attend was \$5.

Additional Information/Reminders

- MSU Extension has continued their invasive species study of McIreland Trail.
- Simmer has continued to work with local artist Jeff Best and the Clare County Arts Council to try and get an art sculpture placed at the south end of town. Simmer has received the grant funds from the Clare County Community Foundation for the public art grant that was wrote for this specific project. Best has confirmed that he will be starting the art piece and Simmer has to start the process for a permit from MDOT to place the art on the east side of the road north of the round-a-bout. The permit approval process could potentially take eight months to complete.
- The conductor will be removed sometime this summer to be re-powder coated. This will be paid for by the Clare County Arts Council.
- Simmer was selected by MPARKS selection committee to be one of the conference committee members for the 2026 conference in Lansing. This will require Simmer to attend periodic zoom meetings and a couple of on-site meetings.
- Simmer has requested the reimbursement for the PIP surfacing from the MDNR and attached all required documents and pictures. The \$30,000 reimbursement has now been completed and received by the City of Clare.

- The 2025 Gateway Affair Friends of Clare County Parks and Recreation (Clare County parks and recreation fundraising event) is scheduled to take place on September 27, 2025. Simmer has created the event flyer, submitted the raffle license application, and created the donation and sponsorship letters, and designed and ordered the raffle tickets. The proceeds from the event will go towards the Depot restroom project. Simmer is also going to create a restroom project flyer that can be shown online.
- Simmer submitted a grant to T-Mobile for the restroom project on June 30, 2025. We should be notified sometime this month if we will be awarded anything.
- Clare Parks and Rec is currently awaiting an estimate to see how much it would be to potentially put pickleball courts in the space at Emerald Isle Recreation Complex where the vacant field area is on the east side of the complex. Once the estimate is back, then it will be taken to the PRAB and then we can explore potential fundraising and grant options if it passes through the board.

Ongoing

- The next Clare Union Depot Governing Board Committee was held on July 9, 2025.
- Clare Parks and Recreation is represented by Simmer on the Friends of Clare County Parks and Recreation Board where Simmer has served as the board secretary since July 2015. There is a monthly meeting for the board and takes place the 4th Tuesday of each month. The next fundraising event for the group will take place at the Moose Lodge of Clare on September 27, 2025.
- Clare Parks and Recreation is continuing to be a part of the Knuckles Knorth group. This regional group focuses on parks and recreation opportunities for Central Michigan → North.
- Clare Parks and Recreation is a part of the MSU Extension – District 6 Advisory Council. This is a committee of outdoor recreation, agriculture, community leaders in the district to join together for the area. It is a newly formed council and will involve 3 meetings a year and is geared to keep everyone informed and involved within the district.
