<u>Lake Shamrock Dredging Project.</u> Mechanical dredging is still paused for fish spawning, but we are getting closer to June 1st when we can resume work. We have hired a new Heavy Equipment Operator for the dredging with the barge after our interviews earlier this month. His name is Kurt Lehmkuhle and he will be starting soon after he completes his two weeks' notice with his current employer. I would like to have him attend an upcoming City Commission meeting so that you can meet him. I would like to start this process with all new hires so that they can see how a City Commission meeting is run and the commissioners have a chance to meet all new employees. The hydraulic dredging contractor is still hard at work on preparing and submitting permits to EGLE but there is no new news currently.

 $\underline{4^{th} \ Street \ Paving.}$ Now that the asphalt plant is back open for the season, the paving of the 4^{th} Street project from last year, that was not able to be completed before winter, is set to be completed on May 19^{th} .

<u>Taste of Clare</u>. The Taste of Clare event (*flyer att'd*) is back again this year hosted by the Clare Area Chamber of Commerce and sponsored by restaurants and businesses throughout the Clare area. The event is being held on Saturday May 13th from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. Hopefully you will have or did have a chance to partake of all the great food and drinks all around the area.

2023 Art in Sculpture: Sculpture Walk. The #DestinationClare Art Sculpture Walk features an outdoor sculpture exhibit that is displayed year-round. The selection committee was comprised of various local artists, business and community leaders and each entry is evaluated on its artistic merit, creativity, public safety, and durability in an outdoor setting. For the 2023 Art in Sculpture Walk there were 10 entries selected to be displayed in various locations (locations att'd) across the main corridor of the downtown area for public viewing. A brochure (att'd) was created for information about the art being showcased in Clare as well as a page for people's choice voting. There were two awards given out at the opening ceremony reception dinner that was held on May 9, 2023, the Bob Guiliani Award (in memory of Bob and was selected by his wife Linda) and the Juried Award (selected by Kim Kleinhardt and Jeff Best). The Sparrow sculpture was the chosen piece for the Bob Guiliani award (located by the Whitehouse) and the Phoenix Rising Piece located outside of Isabella Bank was the juried award winner. The sculptures will remain be in place from now until April 30, 2024 and then will be swapped out for the 2024 art pieces.

<u>Depot Days</u>. Depot Days is a new and upcoming event/fundraiser for outdoor restrooms to be constructed at the Clare Union Railroad Depot. This fundraising event will take place on July 15, 2023 and will be a collaborative effort between community members, organizations, businesses, and the City of Clare. Clare Parks and Recreation and Shari Buccilli are organizing the event and have already secured interest in bakers for a bake sale, entertainment, and silent auction items. A flyer (*att'd*) has been created for the event and there will be a Facebook event page available soon.



Over time, the peacock will develop a beautiful green patina, symbolizing personal transformation as a reminder to those "othered" by society to remain bold, stand tall and take up space.

The Heart kinetic sculpture design uses a gear box to reverse the direction of movement between the two sections. The wind powers the lower section, and the gears reverse that to move the upper section in the opposite direction.

Kelly's art is the fusion of iron and earth. Each piece is unique and symbiotically created from recycled steel paired with metal, clay and glass.

This piece was inspired by the wildlife in the backyard. At first the form is clearly recognizable. But viewed from behind, the bird changes into abstraction. Some refer to the forms as resembling a sunburst. It is similar to watching a flock of birds travel across the path of the sun often becomes obscured from view.

Kwame alludes to an evolutionary process shared as the human experience where active forms are brought together to represent the flux of life. Kwame embraces the transformative concepts such as evolution, metamorphosis and transcendence. Public Art transforms the way people look at visual phenomena in their environment and affects people's attitudes toward their surroundings.

Seven Chakras **Angela Larson** Plymouth, Michigan

Recycled materials, such as reclaimed steel, bring together discarded remnants of the past to make a cohesive statement. The combination of steel and ceramic creates a juxtaposition of these forms. The transformation of steel which is inorganic, machine-like, cold, hard, non-referential, into a drawing space with organic qualities that flow with energy is what she seeks.



Helicopter Seeds Brian Ferriby Empire, Michigan

This sculpture was inspired and curated as an abstract taken from something real and close at hand. In Michigan's late spring, the maple trees offer up millions of "helicopter seeds" which can be identified as the root of this sculpture.
