

Bulk/ Special Services

City of Clare, Michigan

- Bulk pick up is available at no charge to residents within the City of Clare
- Call ahead is needed only on appliances
- GFL will accept one item per week per residence at no charge
- Acceptable items include, but are not limited to:
 - o Bed frames / box springs / mattresses
 - o Bicycles
 - o Cardboard must be flattened and bundled not exceeding 4 x 4 and not exceeding 50 lbs.
 - o Carpet and padding is acceptable rolled and tied with tape or string into 4ft sections no heavier than 50 lbs. 4 bundles equal one bulk item
 - o Furniture
 - o Grills - Gas grills must have propane tank removed prior to disposal
 - o Lawn Mowers - Push Lawn mowers must be drained of oil and/or gas prior to disposal. We do not accept riding lawn mowers
 - o Paint Cans: Paint must be solidified *before* we can pick up. Inform resident to put kitty litter or sand inside wet paint cans to solidify. Throw lid in trash. Once paint is solid, place paint containers at the curb for collection.
 - o Storm doors and windows must have glass broken out of the frame and placed in a hard container or small box, taped well and marked "Broken Glass". Large amounts may require an extra fee
 - o Swing sets
 - o Refrigerators, Freezer, Dehumidifier, Air Conditioner. Freon must be removed. Washers, Dryers, Hot Water Tanks, Dishwashers, Stoves.
 - o Televisions, Microwaves, Stereos, Computer monitors, desktops, and printers are all allowed at no extra charge Maximum 1 complete unit (monitor, desktop, and printer) per pickup. NOTE: Small electronic items such as small radios, alarm clocks, coffee pots, toasters, toaster ovens, can openers, ect., should be bagged with the regular trash. These items will be taken at no additional charge. Again, these are small lightweight items only.
- Unacceptable Items:
 - o Products such as insecticides, oil, gas, propane tanks, antifreeze, concrete, gravel, dirt, sod, rock, stones, stumps, any car parts, car batteries, riding mowers, cement (even if attached to something), bricks, roofing shingles, paint cans with paint still in it, and similar items are also unacceptable.
 - o Tires - Whole tires are not acceptable to collect as trash in Michigan landfills effective November 1, 2004 under Michigan Public Act 34. If tires are cut in half, MAXIMUM 4 halves per week (2 tires)
