RE: Emerald Isle Rec. Complex – Playground Surfacing Bid and Funding Approval

For the Agenda of April 15, 2024

<u>Background.</u> The Master Plan for the Emerald Isle Recreation Complex, which was approved by the City's Planning Commission, included the construction of a new playground (engineering plans attached). Due to the cost of the playground, the Parks & Recreation Advisory Board and the city decided to construct the playground in phases. Phase 1 was completed in 2020, and Phase 2 was completed in 2021. Finishing the playground surfacing is the final phase of the project.

The City Commission previously approved an expenditure of funds from the Hammerberg endowment for the playground equipment project by adoption of Resolution 2021-018 (att'd). Additional funds that were raised and earmarked for playground equipment are held at the Clare County Community Foundation. The Recreation Director has provided a breakdown of funds (*att'd*) for the final phase of the project (Hammerberg funds, CCCF Emerald Isle Complex Donation Account #742, and MDNR Recreation Passport Grant Funds). The approval/acceptance of the funds to be used from the Community Foundation and MDNR grant are now necessary along with the approval of the bid from Sinclair Recreation to complete the final phase of this project. This bid is through the State of Michigan MiDeal program which bids out projects like this for the entire state.

Issues & Questions Specified. Should the city commission approve the expenditure of funds from said entities, and approve the bid from Sinclair Recreation for the installation of the playground surface?

<u>Alternatives</u>.

- 1. Approve the bid and the acceptance and expenditure of funds.
- 2. Do Not Approve the bid and the acceptance and expenditure of funds.
- 3. Set aside the decision regarding this matter to a later date.

Financial Impact. Total cost of the project is \$48,816.60. However, no direct city funds are needed as the entire cost of the project is being covered by funds from the Hammerberg Fund (\$10,000), the Emerald Isle Recreation Complex CCCF Fund (\$8,816.60), and the MDNR Recreation Passport Grant (\$30,000).

<u>Recommendation</u>. I recommend the City Commission approve the bid of Sinclair Recreation for the installation of the Pour In Place Playground Surface at Emerald Isle Recreation Complex as well as the acceptance and expenditure of funds from the Hammerberg Fund, CCCF Emerald Isle Complex Account #742, and the MDNR Recreation Passport Grant by the adoption of Resolution 2024-025 (*att'd*).



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GENERAL NOTES

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- 1. ALL ELEVATIONS ARE BASED ON NAVD 88 DATUM.
- 2. SPECIAL CARE SHALL BE TAKEN IN EXCAVATING IN THE PROXIMITY OF ALL UNDERGROUND UTILITIES. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL SECURE ASSISTANCE FROM THE APPROPRIATE UTILITY COMPANY IN LOCATING ITS LINES. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL ALSO: PROVIDE SUPPORT FOR ANY UTILITY WITHIN THE EXCAVATION, PROVIDE PROPER COMPACTION UNDER ANY UNDERMINED UTILITY STRUCTURE AND, IF NECESSARY, INSTALL TEMPORARY SHEETING OR USE A TRENCH BOX TO MINIMIZE THE EXCAVATION. FOR PROTECTION OF UNDERGROUND UTILITIES AND IN CONFORMANCE WITH PUBLIC ACT 53, 1974, THE CONTRACTOR SHALL DIAL 1-800-482-7171 A MINIMUM OF THREE FULL WORKING DAYS, EXCLUDING SATURDAYS, SUNDAYS, AND HOLIDAYS PRIOR TO BEGINNING EACH EXCAVATION IN AREAS WHERE PUBLIC UTILITIES HAVE NOT BEEN PREVIOUSLY LOCATED. MEMBERS WILL THUS BE ROUTINELY NOTIFIED. THIS DOES NOT RELIEVE THE CONTRACTOR OF THE RESPONSIBILITY OF NOTIFYING UTILITY OWNERS WHO MAY NOT BE PART OF THE "MISS DIG" ALERT SYSTEM.

- 6. CONTRACTOR IS RESPONSIBLE TO FIELD VERIFY EXISTING CONDITIONS PRIOR TO PERFORMING ANY WORK.
- 7. ALL WORK IS TO BE PERFORMED WITHIN THE PUBLIC RIGHT-OF WAY AND/OR ESTABLISHED EASEMENTS. ANY WORK OUTSIDE OF THESE LIMITS SHALL BE APPROVED AND COORDINATED WITH THE PROPERTY OWNER. DOCUMENTATION OF THIS ARRANGEMENT TO BE PROVIDED TO THE CITY/VILLAGE/TOWNSHIP.

- 13. CONTRACTOR TO BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL PERMITS INCLUDING BUILDING, MECHANICAL, PLUMBING, AND ELECTRICAL.
- 14. ALL EXISTING ELECTRICAL, MECHANICAL AND TREATMENT EQUIPMENT TO REMAIN SHALL BE TARPED OR COVERED DURING CONSTRUCTION TO PREVENT DEBRIS FROM DAMAGING EQUIPMENT (I.E. SAW-CUTTING, CONCRETE, ETC.)

SOIL EROSION AND STORM WATER CONTROL NOTES

- 1. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL PROVIDE TEMPORARY SOIL EROSION CONTROL MEASURES PER P.A. 451 AS AMENDED. WITH THE USE OF SILT FENCE AND OTHER TEMPORARY MEASURES THE CONTRACTOR SHALL PROTECT THE ADJACENT AREA FROM ACCELERATED EROSION AND SEDIMENTATION FLOWS RESULTING FROM CONSTRUCTION. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL INSTALL ADDITIONAL TEMPORARY AND PERMANENT SOIL EROSION CONTROL MEASURES, IF DIRECTED BY THE ENGINEER OR SOIL EROSION CONTROL OFFICER, AT NO ADDITIONAL COST TO THE PROJECT.
- 2. INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF TEMPORARY SOIL EROSION CONTROL MEASURES SHALL BE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE CONTRACTOR.
- 3. SHOULD ADDITIONAL SOIL EROSION CONTROL MEASURES BE DETERMINED TO BE NECESSARY BY EITHER THE SOIL EROSION CONTROL OFFICER OR THE OWNER'S ENGINEER THEY SHALL BE IN PLACE NO LATER THAN 24 HOURS FROM THE TIME OF NOTIFICATION TO THE GENERAL CONTRACTOR FOR THE PROJECT. IF NOT PLACED IN 24 HOURS OR LESS ALL ON SITE CONSTRUCTION WILL BE HALTED UNTIL SUCH MEASURES ARE INSTALLED AND APPROVED BY EITHER THE SOIL EROSION CONTROL OFFICER OR THE OWNER'S ENGINEER.
- 4. ALL DISTURBED NON-HARD SURFACE AREAS TO BE STABILIZED WITH TOPSOIL, SEEDED, FERTILIZED AND MULCHED. DISTURBED AREAS SHALL BE TOPSOILED TO A DEPTH NOT LESS THAN FOUR (4) INCHES. SLOPES BETWEEN 1 ON 3 AND 1 ON 2 SHALL BE SODDED AND STAKED OR RECEIVE SEED WITH MULCH BLANKET.
- 5. IF REQUESTED BY THE ENGINEER OR SOIL EROSION CONTROL OFFICER, A WATER TRUCK SHALL BE KEPT ON STAND-BY ON SITE DURING THE CONSTRUCTION PHASE OF THE PROJECT. THE WATER TRUCK SHALL BE USED AS DIRECTED BY THE ENGINEER OR SOIL EROSION CONTROL OFFICER TO CONTROL WIND EROSION.

- 7. A MINIMUM OF TWO (2) FEET OF COVER FROM FINISHED ELEVATIONS SHALL BE MAINTAINED OVER ALL STORM DRAIN PIPES.
- 8. ALL DRAINAGE PIPES THAT OUTLET AT GROUND SURFACE SHALL INCLUDE END SECTIONS.
- ALL EXISTING STORM DRAINS WITHIN THE 9. CONSTRUCTION ZONE TO BE INSTALLED/MONITORED WITH SILT SACKS. SACKS TO BE PULLED AS NEEDED TO KEEP SEDIMENT OUT.
- EXISTING STORM DRAINAGE DITCHES SHALL BE REBUILT 10. IF FILLED IN OR REMOVED DURING CONSTRUCTION. THE CONTRACTOR IS RESPONSIBLE TO REPAIR OR REPLACE, AS REQUIRED, ALL DRAINAGE CULVERTS DAMAGED DURING CONSTRUCTION AND SHALL BE CONSIDERED INCIDENTAL TO THE PROJECT.
- 11. IF CULVERTS ARE ENCOUNTERED DURING EXCAVATION THEY SHALL BE REUSED IF NOT DAMAGED. IF DAMAGED, THE CULVERT SHALL BE REPLACED WITH NEW. ALL CULVERTS IDENTIFIED HAVE BEEN PLACED ON THE DRAWINGS. SOME CULVERTS MIGHT BE ENCOUNTERED THAT ARE NOT DISCLOSED ON THE PLANS. ALL COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH LOCATING AND REPAIRING/REPLACING ARE INCLUDED IN THE COST OF THE PROJECT.
- THE CONTRACTOR SHALL REMOVE ALL SEDIMENT OR 12. SOILS THAT HAVE BEEN DROPPED, WASHED ONTO OR TRACKED OUT ONTO PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY OR PRIVATE ROADS AT THE END OF EACH WORKING DAY OR AFTER EACH RAIN EVENT ON NON-WORK DAYS.
- 13. ALL REMOVED TOPSOIL WILL BE STOCKPILED WITHIN THE PROJECT AREA. IF ADDITIONAL TOPSOIL IS AVAILABLE AFTER TOPSOILING THE CONSTRUCTION AREA, IT WILL BE STOCKPILED WITHIN 1000 FEET OF THE CONSTRUCTION AREA AS DIRECTED BY THE OWNER OR ENGINEER.
- 14. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL REPAIR ALL WASHOUTS AND EROSION DURING THE GUARANTEE PERIOD OF ONE (1) YEAR AT NO ADDITIONAL COST TO THE OWNER.
- 15. ALL RESTORATION SHALL OCCUR WITHIN FIVE (5) DAYS OF FINAL GRADE.



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RESOLUTION 2021-018

A RESOLUTION OF THE CLARE CITY COMMISSION APPROVING A REQUEST TO THE CLARE COUNTY COMMUNITY FOUNDATION FOR DISBURSEMENT OF MONIES FROM THE DR. KUNO HAMMERBERG ENDOWMENT FUND.

WHEREAS, the City of Clare has received a bequest in the amount of \$180,000 from the Dr. Kuno Hammerberg Estate, the monies of said bequest being maintained as the Dr. Kuno Hammerberg Endowment Fund by the Clare County Community Foundation (CCCF) and to be used specifically and solely for recreational and cultural projects that benefit the residents of Clare; and

WHEREAS, the City enjoys a formal agreement with the CCCF regarding the process to disburse funds from said Endowment Fund, said process being approval of a request for disbursement by the Clare City Commission and a subsequent formal request for disbursement of funds by the Clare City Manager; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission has received a request to disburse funds from said Endowment in the amount of \$11,200; and

WHEREAS, the specific items requested to be funded are Emerald Isle Recreation Complex playground surface for \$10,000; and \$1,200 to purchase the 2021 Music Licensing for the Summer Concert Series; and

WHEREAS, said recreation projects associated with said disbursement request have all been previously approved by the City Commission based on a prioritized list recommended to the Clare City Commission by a formally appointed Committee.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Clare City Commission hereby approves a request to disburse Dr. Kuno Hammerberg Endowment Fund monies in the amount of \$11,200 to enable the completion of designated recreation projects within the City of Clare.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the City Commission hereby directs its City Manager to submit a formal request to the Clare County Community Foundation for disbursement of funds in said amount.

ALL RESOLUTIONS AND PARTS OF RESOLUTIONS INSOFAR AS THEY CONFLICT WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS RESOLUTION BE AND THE SAME ARE HEREBY RESCINDED.

PIP SURFACING

Attached is a quote for \$48,816.60 from Sinclair Recreation, who we have been working with over the last couple of years and who installed the Phase 2 playground equipment. The MDNR has approved Sinclair Recreation as the contractor and Gametime as the vendor for the PIP project. This project was awarded a Recreation Passport Grant through the MDNR and they will be covering \$30,000 of the total cost, with \$10,000 coming from the previously approved PIP designated funds by the Hammerberg Committee and the remaining \$8,816.60 coming from the Clare County Community Foundation Emerald Isle Recreation Complex Fund #742.

Myself and the Clare Parks and Recreation Advisory Board recommend that the Commission approve this purchase and approve us to request a disbursement of the \$10,000.00 designated from the Dr. Kuno Hammerberg Fund and reimbursement request for the \$8,816.60 from the Clare County Community Foundation account #742. This disbursement of funds from the Hammerberg Fund was previously approved through the Clare City Commission on March 15, 2021 (Resolution 2021-018), but we were waiting for completion of MDNR agreements, playground installation and Sinclair Recreation PIP scheduling before requesting the funds.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CLARE CITY COMMISSION APPROVING THE BID OF SINCLAIR RECREATION FOR THE INSTALLATION OF THE POUR-IN-PLACE PLAYGROUND SURFACE AT EMERALD ISLE RECREATION COMPLEX, AND APPROVING THE ACCEPTANCE AND EXPENDITURE OF FUNDS FROM THE HAMMERBERG FUND, CCCF EMERALD ISLE COMPLEX ACCOUNT #742, AND THE MDNR RECREATION PASSPORT GRANT TO COVER THE ASSOCIATED COSTS FOR INSTALLATION OF SAID PROJECT.

WHEREAS, the Master Plan for the Emerald Isle Recreation Complex, approved by the City's Planning Commission includes the construction of a playground at said Complex; and

WHEREAS, due to the cost of said playground, the City's Parks & Recreation Advisory Board chose to construct said playground in phases; and

WHEREAS, the final phase for the installation of the surface of the said playground project is \$48,816.60; and

WHEREAS, the City's Recreation Department and Recreation and Advisory Board have requested that the Clare City Commission approve the bid of Sinclair Recreation for the installation of the Pour-In-Place Playground Surface at Emerald Isle Recreation Complex as well as the acceptance and expenditure of funds from the Hammerberg Fund (\$10,000), the Emerald Isle Recreation Complex CCCF Fund (\$8,816.60) and the MDNR Recreation Passport Grant (\$30,000) to cover the costs of said project; and

WHEREAS, the Clare City Commission has duly considered said recommendation and determined approval of the bid and the acceptance and expenditure of funds for the said project to be in the best interests of the City of Clare and its residents.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Clare City Commission hereby approves the bid and acceptance and expenditure of funds and payment to Sinclair Recreation from the Hammerberg Fund (\$10,000), the Emerald Isle Recreation Complex CCCF Fund (\$8,816.60) and the MDNR Recreation Passport Grant (\$30,000) in the total amount of \$48,816.60.
